From an unpublished Bible meditation by late Reverend Richard Wurmbrand HOW TO SUBMIT TO GOD?

One of the most interesting descriptions of the torture imposed by the communist police ("POSEV," Publishing House) is the use of the word "**OBJECT**" for the man assigned to be tortured. You read: "The agent AGDGOMELASHVILI beat bloodily the "**OBJECT**" ISKANDERASHVILI... Agent USPULIAN beat the "**OBJECT**" KUHIANIDZE... There were beatings in all cells, and the jail was full of the screams and cries of the "OBJECTS."

"OBJECT" - this is how prisoners, among them our Christian brethren, are designated by the Communist police. It is the exact fulfillment of LENIN'S thoughts. He had said: "You cannot fry eggs without breaking the shells. You cannot cut wood without making chips fly. So, you cannot make revolution without killing men." (GORKY, Memories of LENIN.) Lenin did not know the difference between egg shells, wood and the sufferings of a man. To him his adversaries were "OBJECTS." A Russian Orthodox priest driven to despair described his suffering in a communist concentration camp: "...There is no martyrdom in the camps, at least not the martyrdom suffered by the great saints of our church. Here there is only (slave) work for the Bolshevik system in which man is gradually consumed like a candle which burns until it is extinguished. By

martyrdom, the man of faith can conquer Satan, and if his sacrifice is pleasant to God, he will enter into the ranks of saints. But by labor, Satan can conquer the man of faith, enslave him, make use of him, exploit him to the bitter end for his own satanic aims. This knowledge is the most terrible temptation that Satan has so far set before me. Pray for me that this satanic despair will leave me." (B. ROEDER, "KATORGA," Heinemann Publishing House) Whoever wishes to be objective in human affairs, in conflicts between nations, races, parties, denominations, first of all degrades men into becoming cold, inanimate **OBJECTS** of research and exploitation. Suffering living beings are nor figures, they are not **OBJECTS**!

Lord Jesus asked the future Apostle PAUL, "...why persecutest thou ME?" Saul of Tarsus could have answered truthfully, "I did not persecute you, only your disciples." But Jesus does not know the difference between Himself and a disciple. His disciples are He. His suffering little brethren and sisters are not OBJECTS of His thoughts, of His cares, of His love — they are He Himself; they are and will be always SUBJECTS. If imprisoned Christians were OBJECTS, it really would make a big difference whether hundreds of thousands or a few score are in prison. But our suffering brethren are not OBJECTS, they are "partakers of the divine nature" (2 Peter 1:4). The church is "His body" (Colossians 1:18). He is in prison even if one single brother suffers there. Now, He is me, because "not I live, but Christ" (Galatians 2:20), Christ who identifies himself with the sufferer. He is my real I. I am for myself always subject, not object. publication, REFORMATORISCH DAGBLADET of 7/20/1978, had a big headline: "WURMBRAND TOTALLY REJECTS SCHOLARLY OBJECTIVITY." So it is. When we speak about men, objectivity is wrong. We must be passionately on the side of truth, love, and the sufferers, while being blind and deaf to the arguments of our enemies. The church of Christ is right. Its oppressors and traitors who compromise with the tyrants are wrong and despicable. There exists no in-between. God Himself said, "I will put enmity between the seed of the woman (the Savior) and the seed of the serpent" (Genesis 3:15) Enmity, and not objective research, compromise and peaceful co-existence. This applies to Communist persecution of Christians, as well as to political and private life. This also applies to relationships between groups of men. Righteousness must triumph. Whoever is not anti-Communist is not Christian, as whoever is not anti-devil is not Christian. Marxism is Satanic as I documented in my book "Was Karl Marx a Satanist?" The Communist doctrine cannot be Christianized, nor can the devil's legions be evangelized. We refuse any objectivity in this matter and advise you, if you stand for a righteous cause, to refuse "objectivity," too. "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Greetings, dear brother! We learned about you from Sergey Porkhun. My name is Vyacheslav, I have been a member of the Baptist Church since 1998, I live in Ukraine in the city of Boyarka, where I served as a deacon of the church. I have three underage children, when the war began on February 24, we were in our city for 9 days, gun shots were heard, rockets flew through our city, being on a robot in a boiler room for two days without a shift, I was scared, I didn't know what to do. My family and I prayed, looked for an answer, what to do, go somewhere or stay. We decided to stay, but when the evacuation began in our city, we decided to try to go by train, but we didn't succeed, there were a lot of people who wanted to leave Kyiv. We were confused as to what to do. I started calling friends to ask for advice, help. One community in our city evacuated people to Western Ukraine. And they promised to help us. And it was a miracle, because the train that we thought to leave on the second attempt was canceled. The next day we went to Western Ukraine, the way that before the war we traveled for 4-5 hours, we drove 20 hours. It was very hard; the children were very tired. We were received by our friends in the city of Borshchiv. We stayed there for two weeks, where we worked at the church, on the church plot, cleared away trees. But my heart was not calm, sirens sounded there too, plus the fear

of being called up for war, we began to pray what to do, and then my friends who left to Poland, they persuaded us to leave from there, we decided to go to Poland without fully understanding where we would live, how we would be there. But God provided, we were given a small house with one room where we live five. I had to go to work at a construction site, and also for work I had to leave for another city for five days. It's hard for my wife to heat the stove alone so that it is warm and there is hot water. And from today I was left without a job, so the employer began to humiliate me, I tried to talk to him about God, he made fun of me, said that there was no God and I had to leave him. Sincerely, the Semenenko family.

Good afternoon, dear Michael: We are the Porkhun family, I am Sergej, and my wife Larisa, we have three children, Daughter – Mylana (15 years old) Son – Timofii (14 years old) Son – Daniil (10 years old) We lived in the city of Bucha, where our children went to school, my wife worked as a teacher. I worked in the city of Kiev. We always (even before we got married) went to church in Kiev - and were, and are members of this church - "Salvation Church" on General Pukhov Street - 4. After we were married, we went to live in Bucha, and so continued to live here in the house (which was left by my grandmother) We always went to the Baptist Church in Kiev, where we were baptized. After moving to live in Bucha, we always went to Kiev Baptist Church, which is 20 km (or 13 miles) from Kiev. Until the war began - February 24. On the second day (February 25) we left Bucha, and went into the village near Bucha 40 km (or 25 miles) - Makarov.

We spent 5 days there, and when a bomb fell on our house, a girl was wounded and her mother died. (The town of Bucha, Ukraine, was the site of most horrid massacres by Putin's Russian soldiers. According to the mayor and other local authorities, approximately 1,000 bodies have been recovered from the town, including 31 children. Photo evidence showed corpses of civilians, lined up with their hands bound behind their backs, shot at point-blank range, which ostensibly gave proof that summary executions had taken place. N. Ed.) We couldn't stay there any longer and decided to leave, we didn't have gasoline. The local military gave us some gasoline and we were able to take secret paths through the forest. Thus, we found ourselves on the road leading to the city of Ternopil and ended up in a church of our friends in the town of Borshchiv. After spending the night there and filling up a full tank of gasoline, we headed for the border with Poland. We have an old car (Daewoo Lanos 2004) We have never driven long distances, and here, with God's help, we drove for so long. Poland opened their border to Ukrainian refugees and we were able to drive through. Here in Poland (the town of Czestochowa) there is a very small church, a few people. The pastor does not speak English, only Polish.

Ukrainian Christian Refugees Helped with your Gifts

Dear contributors:

My gratitude to all who donated generously toward helping so many refugees from Ukraine, a true flood of displaced individuals. More than 4 million have escaped the current war and another 3 million are expected to come out. If one reads the daily news, one will be convinced easily these are not exaggerated figures. These are persons who flee from extensive bombing and continuing total destructions of whole towns.

It happens that my birth country, Romania and the Republic of Moldova (also a Romanian language country) have together the longest common border with Ukraine. At the same time, Romania is one of the poorest countries in the European Union and Moldova is economically worse. Between Romania and Moldova so far, nearly 1 million Ukrainians have sought refuge already. Refugees come at times at the rate of 10,000/24 hours. Most of these refugees are women with 3 to 8 children. Fortunately, many other countries in Europe and North America are accepting to resettle these refugees, if they can arrive there. Many churches outside Romania, have sent transportation means, like buses and even chartered flights. These refugees speak Ukrainian and Russian. Here and there, the communality of the Romanian language is of help since some border localities like the university town of Czernowitz (name in German, Cernauti in Romanian) where my mother was born, used to be part of Romania before WWII. Some of the younger generation might have a little knowledge of English.

Through many reliable contacts of many years in Romania, we concentrated on helping with local Romanian currency of US \$200 to \$2,000 per family of **Christian believers** refugees. Many came out with only the shirt on their back. There were miles long lines at the border. Through the local Christians who deserve all praise, we provide pocket money given in hand for food and believers' lodging for a few days, until there is a partial resolution as to near future plans of settling some place somehow or moving-on further to other countries. \$2,000 seems to be a large sum for an elderly couple who could escape but most couples come out with larger groups of 10 to 15 children and grandchildren. Just as one example, we paid for a Victoria village home, \$6,000 for a one-month lodging and food for 3 adults and 12 children. Most of these refugees entertain the illusion of taking refuge out of their native country and their lodging and work, for a short time but the way the news comes out on this prolonged war, I doubt this will be the case. I believe these refugees will remain refugees for many years to come. We publish in this newsletter a few receipts of scores more, documenting what I wrote above. Above, a sample only of a long list, our mission was able to compile beside other lists, of over 480 elderly Baptist Christians most of them still alive, who suffered for the Christian faith in the former Soviet Union. The prison sentences amounted from 2 years, to as many as 18 years of communist prison. If considered together, their years of prisonsentences shown in our abbreviated table, would most likely add up to over 2,000 years of prison. The 4th and 5th column together, show year of birth and the most recent country they live in (like Ukraine, Russia, Kazakhstan, Belarus, etc.) We try obtain exact addresses, so we may be able to send encouraging help to those still alive. We were able to send repeated help to about 120 such elderly Russian-speaking Christians and over 110 of other languages. Many of their testimonies you can read in the monthly newsletter.
