"Nor of men sought we glory, neither of you, nor yet of others, when we might have been burdensome, as the apostles of Christ." (I Thessalonians 2:6)

Late Reverend Richard Wurmbrand spent 14 years in Romanian communist prisons. Mrs. Wurmbrand was imprisoned for nearly three years, also for her Christian faith, in some of the same communist prisons.

From an unpublished Bible meditation by late Reverend Richard Wurmbrand **BURDENSOME CHRISTIANITY**

A Christian is supposed to be humble in his private affairs. When hit on one cheek he turns the other. The canvas never quarrels with the painter. He is free to paint on it what he likes, be it a beggar or a king. The Christian accepts any condition in life as coming from God. If he is successful, he does not boast of it. Can a brush boast that a beautiful picture has been drawn with it? Only the master-painter deserves glory. So is our relationship with Christ. A Christian seeks glory from nobody.

Therese of Lisieux gives a little illustration in her autobiography. One day while standing near a sister who was washing the laundry, she was inadvertently splashed in her face with dirty water. If Therese had left suddenly without uttering a word of reproach, the sister might have guessed that she had done something wrong and been sad about it. If she had said "Stop it!, a quarrel might have arisen.

Therese said to herself, "What is wrong with being splashed with dirty water? Jesus, the Son of God, allowed Himself to be spat upon." Thinking like this, she began to like the dirt with which

she was sprinkled. For you, too, this is the best response when subjected to humiliations in private life.

Christ was humble, as was St. Paul, though their humility had a feature apart: it was difficult to make others understand it. Jesus had to say: "I seek not mine own glory" (John 8:50) and "I am meek and lowly in heart" (Matthew 11: 29). Paul also had to assure men that he sought no glory. Normally, a humble man does not go around boasting about his humility. It is only when he makes an impression of great pride, or even arrogance, that he has to explain what is in him.

A Christian is humble in his own affairs, yet he is very sure that he has a message from God. This he asserts with full authority, ready to contend with anybody, even to the point of being considered burdensome or annoying, or giving the impression of being an "I-know better" man. "Apostles of Christ might be burdensome" (I Thessalonians 2:6). Paul was such when he wrote that he sought no glory from men.

We also are unworthy messengers, but we have a worthy message, It consists in telling Christians Of the free world about the heroes of faith in countries dominated by communists, in telling the churches and believers in the free world that to be shallow and lukewarm is a grave sin and that we should take example from the martyrs of faith in Communist lands and choose their heroic Christian lifestyle and luminous example.

Would you give up witnessing for your faith at your place of work if this were burdensome for your employer and you might risk losing your job? The heroic choice is the Christian one.

I have often seen youth in the free world who were sad because they could not study, instead of accepting lovingly whatever God decides is best for them. Would you witness for your faith knowing that, though having a physician's diploma you would have to be a porter? The heroic choice is always the right one in Christianity. Become a porter shouting Hallelujah. A whole chapter of the Bible (I Chronicles 26) puts the porters who loved the Lord on a roll of honor. If God honors porters who serve Him and rejects millionaires who deny Him, why not prefer to be a porter? We know that we will be considered burdensome and arrogant for criticizing the average Christian manner of life. It is our right to seem burdensome for we have God's message. He rejects the lukewarm, He spits them out of His mouth. (Revelation 3:16) Therefore everyone has to choose a heroic attitude in meeting the problems of life, whatever the cost.

In daytime we could stand in line to buy bread and cereals. I had a supply and I helped 10 people, I cooked for them. When I left, I passed 16 Russian controls. That's why I was very afraid. My children and grandchildren are staying in Snihurivka, Ukraine. I received 800 lei (US \$200.)"

Ukrainian Christian Refugees Helped with your Gifts

April 16, 2022 Dear contributors:

My gratitude to all who donated generously toward helping so many refugees from Ukraine, a true flood of displaced individuals. More than 4 million have escaped the current war and another 3 million are expected to come out. If one reads the daily news, one will be convinced easily these are not exaggerated figures. These are persons who flee from extensive bombing and continuing total destructions of whole towns.

It happens that my birth country, Romania and the Republic of Moldova (also a Romanian language country) have together the longest common border with Ukraine. At the same time, Romania is one of the poorest countries in the European Union and Moldova is economically worse. Between Romania and Moldova so far, nearly 1 million Ukrainians have sought refuge already. Refugees come at times at the rate of 10,000/24hours. Most of these refugees are women with 3 to 8 children. Fortunately, many other countries in Europe and North America are accepting to resettle these refugees, if they can arrive there. Many churches outside Romania, have sent transportation means, like buses and even chartered flights. These refugees speak Ukrainian and Russian. Here and there, the communality of the Romanian language is of help, since some border localities like the university town of Czernowitz (name in German, Cernauti in Romanian) where my mother was born, used to be part of Romania before WWII. Some of the younger generation might have a little knowledge of English.

Through many reliable contacts of many years in Romania, we concentrated on helping with local Romanian currency of US \$200 to \$2,000 per family of Christian believers refugees. Many came out with hardly more than the shirt on their back. There were miles long lines at the border. Through the local Christians who deserve all praise, we provide pocket money given in hand for food and believers' lodging for a few days, until there is a partial resolution as to near future plans of settling some place somehow or movingon further to other countries. \$2,000 seems to be a large sum for an elderly couple who could escape but most couples come out with larger groups of 10 to 15 children and grandchildren. Just as one example, we paid for a Victoria village home, \$6,000 for a one-month lodging and food for 3 adults and 12 children. Most of these refugees entertain the illusion of taking refuge out of their native country and their lodging and work, for a short time but the way the news comes out on this prolonged war, I doubt this will be the case. I believe these refugees will remain refugees for many years to come. We publish in this newsletter a few receipts of scores more, documenting what I wrote above. Again, thanks and God Bless. Above, a sample only of a long list, our mission was able to compile beside other lists, of over 480 elderly Baptist Christians most of them still alive, who suffered for the Christian faith in the Soviet Union. The former prison sentences amounted from 2 years, to as many as 18 years of communist prison. If considered together, their years of prisonsentences shown in our abbreviated table, would most likely add up to over 2,000 years of prison. The 4th and 5th column together, show year of birth and the most recent country they live in (like Ukraine, Russia, Kazakhstan, Belarus, etc.) We try obtain exact addresses, so we may be able to send encouraging help to those still alive. We were able to send repeated help to about 120 such elderly Russian-speaking Christians and over 110 of other languages. Many of their testimonies you can read in the monthly newsletter.
